

- Students found to be present while a violation is occurring may be considered participants and may also be subject to student conduct action.
- Prohibited items described in these policies will be confiscated and may be discarded.

The following behavior is prohibited in all Barnard residence halls:

I. ALCOHOL & OTHER DRUGS

- Alcohol violation – possessing or using alcohol in violation of the College alcohol policy.
- Alcohol intoxication – public intoxication is a violation of policy, regardless of age.
- Being in the presence of alcohol or other drug policy violation.
- Possession of alcoholic beverage containers in violation of Residential Life Policy.
- Drug policy violation – possessing or use/misuse of illicit drug, prescription medication or other intoxicating substance.
- Drug or smoking paraphernalia- possession of smoking devices and paraphernalia.
- Distribution of alcohol, drugs, or other intoxicant

POLICY AGAINST DISCRIMINATION AND HARASSMENT

Barnard College is guided by the precept that in no aspect of its employment practices or educational programs should there be disparate treatment of persons because of improper considerations of race, color, religion, creed, national or ethnic origin, sex, sexual orientation, age or disability. While Barnard College has long had an express policy against improper discrimination, it is to be understood that policy also explicitly encompasses the goal that faculty, staff and students are to be able to work and study free from harassment by any member of the College community.

Residential Life is committed to fostering a healthy and safe living and learning environment. Students will not

engage in any form of harassment, intimidation, threat, or abuse (whether verbal or written, physical or psychological, direct or implied) which is intended for a specific member or group within the community. This includes (but is not limited to) harassment in person, via telephone or voicemail, postal mail, forms of electronic communication (e.g. email, Facebook, other web communities), or having someone else do so on your behalf. Such behavior or actions, whether done intentionally or with reckless disregard, are not permitted in the residence halls. "It was just a joke" or "I was intoxicated" are not acceptable excuses. Students are responsible for their behavior and that of their guest(s) at all times.

Barnard College does not tolerate and specifically prohibits any and all harassment against any person by a member of the College community. Appropriate disciplinary action may be taken against those found to have committed harassment, up to and including dismissal. ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY

Barnard strongly supports educational and treatment programs as the most effective means to help reduce and prevent alcohol and drug abuse. At the same time, the College prohibits the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students, faculty members, or staff members while on College property or while participating in College-sponsored activities or conducting College business off-premises. DRUGS: Students who are prescribed medications are the only individuals permitted to use them, as prescribed, and are responsible for monitoring and securing their own medications. The use of synthetic substances or other items ingested for intoxication effect is also prohibited. Any paraphernalia designed or used to ingest illegal drugs, including (but not limited to) bongos, roach clips, hookahs, vaporizers or pipes are not permitted in the residence halls. If found these items will be confiscated and not returned to the student.

ALCOHOL: Students are only allowed to purchase, possess, consume and serve alcoholic beverages in accordance with New York State laws (21 years of age or older) and the guidelines set forth in Barnard College Policy. **Public intoxication is a violation of residence hall policy, regardless of age.** Alcohol or alcoholic beverage containers may not be kept in any room whose residents are under the age of 21.

Residents age 21 or older may possess and consume alcoholic beverages (referred herein "alcohol") within residence halls in accordance with the following:

- Students of legal drinking age who bring alcohol into or possess alcohol in a residence hall are responsible for its legal use. This includes taking reasonable precautions to prevent the possession of alcohol by underage students and guests.
- Alcohol may be consumed only within assigned rooms or suites. Open containers of alcohol are prohibited in common spaces such as hallways and lounges, in public areas such as lobbies, or in outdoor areas adjacent to residence halls, except as outlined in the College's alcohol policy.
- Common source beverage containers (e.g. kegs, beer balls, punch bowls) and/or excessive amounts of alcohol are not permitted in residence halls, nor are any empty alcohol containers. Devices or mechanisms that facilitate rapid consumption (funnel bongos, etc.) are also prohibited. If found these items will be confiscated and not returned to the student.
- Participation in activities that facilitate or promote the rapid, dangerous, and/or forced consumption of alcohol (i.e. drinking games) is prohibited. Alcohol may not be sold or distributed in the residence halls. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to: cash bars; events to which admission tickets are sold or fees are
