On September 17, 2008 at 3:30pm a special Advancement Committee Hearing was convened in Room 301 at the College of Community and Public Affairs to consider Andre Massena's readiness for advancement in the social work program. The committee members were Sunha Choi, Dennis Chapman and Josephine Allen. Allen chaired the meeting. Also present were Andre Massena, Laura Bronstein, Department Chair, Diane Wiener, Mr. Massena's academic advisor, Stanley Gluck, and five community members who were invited by Mr. Massena.

At the conclusion of the hearing and after very careful consideration, the Committee makes the following recommendation:

In accordance with the Student Advancement Policy, Mr. Massena will select a mentor from among the social work faculty with whom to meet regularly in order to reflect on, explore and discuss the development of his effective 'professional use of self.' A paper will be developed during this time on the subject of "effective professional strategies in the ethical practice of 'macro' social work in the early 20th century." The specifications contained in item number 8 of the September 2, 2008 written plan for Mr. Massena will be followed. This process will begin immediately and completed between January 2, 2009 and May 8, 2009.

At that time, Mr. Massena's advancement in the program will be reconsidered and, pending departmental approval, he may be eligible for continuance.

In addition, Mr. Massena will agree to withdraw from the two social work classes in which he is currently enrolled in order to complete these provisions.

It is the Committee's hope that Mr. Massena will be able to proceed in a reflective manner so that all of his decisions and actions are ones that prepare him for a professional lifetime of effective and ethical social work practice.
